President's report

This report covers activity from January – December 2023.

Thank you to all our hardworking members for their efforts across a busy year - as well as our funders and supporters who made a great deal possible for Healesville Community Garden.

Governance and membership

- We held a Special General Meeting, April 2023, to adopt the Model Rules for an Incorporated Association (Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012), change the financial year to 'ending 31 December' and accept the purpose of the association
- By December, 100% of the polyhouse planter boxes and 96% of the garden plots were let. We were thrilled to welcome 8 new members and thank existing members for their ongoing support.
- Our members handbook and site management guide were updated
- We reviewed our Child Safe policy and developed a Child Safe Commitment and Obligations document which was presented at the September members meeting. The presentation document was shared with the Community Gardens Network (Yarra Ranges) in October as a resource that can be used by other community gardens.



Grants

- Victorian Government 'Our Suburbs: Living Local' grant (2022-23). Works included signage at the entrance to the garden and across the site, polyhouse upgrade (new plastic cover, a row of new planter boxes and a wider path in front of the new planter boxes), adding flood-proof shelving to the shed, grading the main path and laying new gravel, installing a solar-powered security camera, purchasing new chairs and bench, purchasing a new shed lock and keys, plus a range of consumable items.
- Community Bank Healesville (2023). We were successful in our application for a small grant to print banners for events.
- Federal Volunteers Grant (2023-24). We successfully applied to Aaron Violi MP, Federal Member for Casey for this grant. We progressed to the next stage of the selection process and are awaiting the outcome.
- Yarra Ranges Council Community Development grant (2024). Funding is to support our events in 2024 (including presenters' costs, event expenses and promotions).
- Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal grant (2024). We applied for funding to instal a new water tank in the south-east corner of the garden, butterfly vents for the polyhouse, replace old planter boxes in the polyhouse and finish work on the main path.

The site was maintained to a good standard throughout the year by several dedicated members. This included plantings in communal areas to grow food and reduce weeds, regular mowing and weeding, and keeping the easement and fence lines clear. Further work needs to be done on the fence lines to manage grass and weeds.

The informal monthly working bees (which are in addition to our quarterly working bees for all members) have been a wonderful way for members to meet their 2 hours/month obligation to keep the garden tidy and get to know other garden members.

The community compost hub was managed by a few members, primarily Bruce McMicking. After the introduction of FOGO bins, there was a significant reduction in contributions by the community, but some residents continue to bring their food scraps. The hub is still viable as a compost system for the community garden.



Events

We initiated, or were the venue for, an exciting range of events.

These included:

- Healesville Homegrown Food Fair April (attended by Cr Fiona McAllister, Ryrie Ward with a Welcome to Country by Thane Garvey-Gannaway and stalls by a wide range of community groups and Community Bank Healesville)
- Mushroom Walks x 2 May (led by Marcus Kaye)
- Training Exercise for CFA Volunteers, Healesville Fire Brigade May (led by Cliff Overton, garden member and CFA fire fighter)
- Yarra Ranges Council's School Holiday Activities July (site visit led by Michelle Lehmann, Early Years Community Support Officer)
- Hidden Story Books July (school holiday activity initiated by The Mental Project, led by Steve Curry)
- Spring into Spring Gardening Workshop October (presented by Marcus Kaye)
- Gardening in Small Spaces Workshop November (presented by Marcus Kaye)
- Community Gardens Open Day November (inaugural event initiated by Community Gardens Australia)
- Social gathering for members December (many members joined in and brought food and drink to share)
- Pathways for Carers Walk December (end-of-year celebration for this carers group)

Stakeholder relations and community engagement

We maintained a positive relationship with Yarra Ranges Council workers (including the Parks and Bushlands team, Community Development Officers and the grants team).

We also maintained positive relationships with Healesville Library, Permaculture Yarra Valley, the Community Alliance for Waste Reduction and Sustainability, HICCI, Healesville Connect and Healesville Bowling Club. Healesville Connect continues to be a close collaborator and supporter of the community garden.

We were invited to give a presentation at the Yarra Ranges Council's 2024 Annual Grants recipients celebration in December 2023.

We attended Community Gardens Network meetings, participated in a video to promote Healesville Community Garden and were chosen to be the venue for the Art of Pizza Making workshop in 2024.

We were invited by Eastern Health's Health Promotion Officers to participate in their 'Over 50s Active Living Survey'.
